Some pumps require changeover to metal adapters from plastic (cracking over time). Some fittings were purchased however are wrong size, GA to sort out issue. O-rings and plastic plugs (8) to be purchased to replace worn out parts. RD.

Purchase of new pump to replace unit used by road committee. Road committee to provide funds for replacement unit.

Remove scrub from around fire trailer. GA (Complete). Area around fire trailer requires some weed whacking. EN and GM. (Complete).

Total Members 172 updated Aug 2022 Total Credits 816

1 credit is charged for each 30 second message that reaches each cottager or leaves a message. 60 sec. = 2 credits etc. Maximum message duration is 120 seconds. At present we have \$8.90 credit towards purchasing additional credits weratorhich will be applied at that time.

250 credits —-\$ 24.75 500 credits —-\$ 47.50 1000 credits —- \$ 89.00 US DOLLARS.

Motion on floor to test system annually. (Late May). Rick Dansereau second Gord Hill. Motion passed unanimously. (Email to all members will be sent three days before to cottagers notifying of upcoming test.)

**Equipment Report**: Replace pump unit road committee has used with package unit, (Pump,hose,fittings,dolly, etc.) apron cost 1200.00 CAN. Greg Agerbak to take care of this items. Value of pump given over to road committee was decided at 200.00 CAN. The cost difference to be absorbed by road committee.

Metal fittings for pump discharge were purchased to convert from plastic, fitting size is incorrect, GA to resolve.

Last falls equipment checks were not done correctly. (gas left in pump carburators) pumps would not start. Proper procedure to be reviewed this fall check.

There was a re-affirmation that two equipment checks are required for these units to try to ensure their reliability. All Agreed.

### Projects:

Spring Cleanup was not a success, it was decided that the fire committee take responsibility for organizing a spring cleanup each year in order to provide some continuity. Motion: G.H. second B.D. All agreed. Rick Dansereau to organize.

Proposal to investigate acquiring a truck with tank for fire abatement and road work. Accepted. GA and RD to provide options at next meeting.

Pile of scrub beside fire trailer requires removal and weed wacking as well. Greg A will see about removal of material. Ed Nolin will do the weed whacking and apply some weed killer as well to reduce the maintenance. Cal Mix. to be applied

Dust Control: Item 2 on Road committee meeting Motion to purchase 50-25 kg bags of flake calcium chloride @ \$1470.00 plus tax and \$340.00 delivery . for distribution to local cottage owners for dust control.



Note: remainder of funds (\$ 4707.62) will be used for brushing by Whitford Paving Co. This is a preliminary effort to iron out any issues before we proceed with our entire area. Whitford has agreed to locate their equipment at his cottage area and begin from there. Once we determine how much can be done in an allotted time we will put together a proposal to do our entire cottage area (splitting costs, and including contribution by Man Hydro).

Motion to accept financial Report : Bob Dyck / Sec Ed Nolin motion passed.

# Projects:

- 1. Applying binder after gravelling: To reduce the frequency of grading during the summer months an application of binder would help. Applying water could also assist in dust control. Acquiring a truck / tank to facilitate application of water would help. Costs and scheduling by Greg Agerbak and Rick Dansereau by end of March 2023.
- 2. Dust control in local cottage areas: Past practice was to purchase calcium chloride from parks to individual cottagers. This has lapsed. Road committee will present a proposal at fall Agm to purchase 1 pallet of dry flake calcium chloride approx cost \$1,470.00 and offer for sale by 25 kg bag to interested cottagers. We have acquired a material spreader which mounts on the trailer hitch of a vehicle which will provide a method of application for the flake material. Rick Dansereau to make motion and take care of details, (acquiring product and arrange sale to cottagers).
- 3. Emergency access road for Easy Street residence: It has been noted that evacuation of the point area by road is a weak link. This is especially true for residence of Easy Street. A proposal is being developed to provide an alternate route for these. The residents effected will be consulted and a (plan if approved )with cost estimate and timing put in place for the budget year 2024. Interested residents that would like to take an active part in this effort please contact Greg Agerbak.
- 4. Brushing side of the road: As noted in budget 2022 above some money has been allocated for brushing. This is a preliminary effort to provide a realistic picture of requirements for a complete job involving all cottage areas. Whitford Paving has agreed to provide the equipment for this effort. After this effort an evaluation of time, materials, areas, and costs will be submitted to road committee to move this effort forward. We expect if approved would be included in 2024 budget.

#### **Notes**

As an example our road system has been improved significantly of the past five years because of volunteers! Time commitment is not overwhelming and new people mean new ideas on how to address issues.
